I spent this summer interning for Rentenbach Construction as an Assistant Project Engineer. I was given the opportunity to work on the 20 million-dollar Tennessee School for the Deaf High School and Dining Hall project. My day-to-day responsibilities were to review plans to create submittals and RFIs for drawings that needed clarification as well as walk the jobsite to log quality issues. By the time I completed my summer position, the Dining Hall had opened and received all certifications to service the students. The High School will be completed this November and students will attend in January. During my time with Rentenbach, I gained a better understanding of how the construction industry operates and the importance of communication between owners, architects, contractors, and sub-contractors.
