



**Department Head Annual Evaluation Report  
for  
Ernest Brewer**

Dr. Ernest Brewer had a productive year in 2005. Outlined below are some highlights of the year.

**Research/scholarship/creative activity**

Dr. Brewer co-authored five refereed journal articles in 2005, including publications in *Journal of Career Development*, *Journal of Child and Youth Care Forum*, *Journal of Industrial Teacher Education*, *Hispanic Journal of Behavioral Sciences*, and *International Journal of Vocational Education and Training*. He presented papers at NAVUBPP, SAEOPP Conference, and National Educational Opportunity Center Association. He also was a presenter in federally funded training conducted through Western Kentucky University. He currently has two manuscripts under review as proposed chapters in the *Encyclopedia of Measurement and Statistics*. Dr. Brewer continued as the principal investigator/director of six federally funded projects with a total of more than \$2,000,000 in funding. As a part of his responsibility to these grants, he wrote or co-authored six research/technical reports during the year. In addition he co-produces a number of newsletters associated with these projects.

**Teaching**

Dr. Brewer has substantial grant responsibilities and therefore has a reduced teaching load. However, student evaluations of the courses that he does teach are excellent. His course syllabi were quite thorough, providing all the details and structure students needed about his courses. Student comments are consistent with the high marks he received on the tabulated reports. Dr. Brewer served as chair for four doctoral students, including one 2005 graduate. He also served as a committee member for an additional 14 doctoral students and one masters student. Dr. Brewer received a 15-Year Teaching Award from the National Training Institute, IBEW-NECA, NJATC.

**Service**

Within the department, Dr. Brewer chairs the Grants and Contracts Committee. He served as a CEHHS representative to the University Faculty Senate and served on the Library and the Faculty/Staff Benefits Committees within the Senate. He continued his service as the Faculty Counselor for Kappa Delta Pi, Nu Delta Chapter. He also served as an EAP/McNair Advisory Board Member at UT. He served on the Institutional Research Advisory Committee at Pellissippi State Technical Community College. Dr. Brewer has continued in his role as editor of the *International Journal of Vocational Education and Training*. He also served on the Editorial Board of the *Journal of Educational Opportunity*. In 2005 Dr. Brewer served as the Vice-President of the National Association of Industrial and Technical Teacher Education and advances into the presidency in 2006. He received the Outstanding Service Award from the International Vocational Education and Training Association. Dr. Brewer was a vocational expert for the Department of Health and Human Services, Social Security Administration, Office of Hearings and Appeals. He also continued as a trainer with the National Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee. Dr. Brewer provided a critique of a proposed book for Wiley Publishing.
