

Research/scholarship/creative activity

Dr. Brewer completed work on chapters published in edited volumes, including one chapter in *Preference Reference for Teachers* with a 2006 copyright. Other chapters completed in 2006 with a 2007 copyright include one in *Encyclopedia of Measurement Statistics, Volume 1* and *Encyclopedia of Measurement Statistics, Volume 3*. Dr. Brewer presented five papers at several conferences, including the National Veterans' Conference, the 34th Annual SAEOPP Conference, and U. S. Department of Education Training Grant conducted through Western Kentucky University. Dr. Brewer continued as the principal investigator/director of six federally funded projects with a total of more than \$2,000,000 in funding. As a part of his responsibility to these grants, he wrote or co-authored six research/technical reports during the year. He submitted five new 5-year competitive grant proposals, with a total of over \$9.5 million in requested funding. In addition he co-produces a number of newsletters associated with these projects. He currently has two manuscripts submitted for review to refereed journals.

Teaching

Dr. Brewer has substantial grant responsibilities and therefore has a reduced teaching load. However, student evaluations of the courses that he does teach are excellent, with no score falling below a 4.0 and most above 4.5. These ratings are well above the College and University averages. His course syllabi are thorough, providing all the details and structure students needed about his courses. Student comments are consistent with the high marks he receives on the tabulated reports. Dr. Brewer is currently serving as chair for two doctoral students and one masters student. He is on an additional 15 doctoral committees and 2 masters committees.

Service

Dr. Brewer engages in a wide variety of service within the community and profession. I have highlighted a sample of the types of service in which he has been engaged over the past year, rather than attempting to produce an exhaustive list. Dr. Brewer has continued in his role as editor of the *International Journal of Vocational Education and Training*. He also served on the editorial board of the *Journal of Educational Opportunity* and *Journal of Educational Research and Reviews*. He was a reviewer for *Human Resource Management Journal*, and *Journal of International Studies in Educational Administration*. In 2006 Dr. Brewer completed his term as Vice-President of the National Association of Industrial and Technical Teacher Education. He served on the Institutional Research Advisory Committee at Mississippi State Technical Community College. On

campus, he completed his six year term as a CEHHS representative to the University Faculty Senate and member of the Faculty/Staff Benefits Committee in May 2006. However, he continued his service on the Faculty Senate Library Committee. He continued his service as the Faculty Counselor for Kappa Delta Pi, Nu Delta Chapter. He also served as an EAP/McNair Advisory Board Member at UT. Within the department, Dr. Brewer chairs the Grants and Contracts Committee. His work has been honored and recognized by several different groups, including the International Vocational Education and Training Association, and the National Association of Veterans UB Project Personnel.

Dr. Brewer sets high standards for himself in research, teaching and service and consistently achieves these standards. The goals he has articulated for 2007 reflect his intention to continue at this highly productive level for another year.
