

# HOME IMPROVEMENTS

Over the past year, Epsilon Eta has begun a series of home improvements. We began with the absolute necessities. The electrical wiring was first. Each room in the house was rewired, and the project is nearly complete. We recently had work done on the plumbing in the upstairs bathrooms as well.

Our plans for the summer are many. We are looking into new curtains for all of the downstairs windows, hoping to replace the aged curtains which hang there at present. We are also planning to get black velvet-type curtains for the closets located on either side of the chapter room. The present drapes are extremely worn out. The new drapes would match the one which hangs at the entrance to the chapter room, thus adding contunuity.

We also have plans to have a wrought iron gate constructed across the front of the chapter room. We hope to make the chapter room the sacred place that it should be, holding the mysteries of our fraternity within its closed doors. We have had three estimates for the construction of the gate, all around \$850.

Our plans include a redesign of the bar and pool room areas. A new design will allow television to be watched from any location in the pool room. The change will create a more versatile bar and party area and a more comfortable "group" living environment. Since the plans for the new design are not final at this time, a total cost has not yet been determined.
